

The full picture of the curriculum






The Core Subjects

- English (5 hours per week)
 = 2 GCSEs; Language and Literature
- Maths (4 hours per week) = 1 GCSE
- Double Award Science (5 hours per week) = 2GCSEs
- PE (2 hours per week)
- PSHE (1 hours per week)



Subject Choices (Preferences)

Although the process is generally a 'free choice' process with students choosing the subjects they wish to study there is one caveat

To meet the guidance from the Department for Education to ensure a 'broad and balanced' curriculum. students will need to choose at least one of the following subjects

French, Geography, History, Spanish or Triple Science

Additional Limitations

The only other limits we place are linked to the facilities in school for specialist subjects.

It is not possible to choose both Drama and Dance, it is one or the other. This is due to the need to use the studio spaces for these subjects.

It is also not possible to choose both DT Food and Product Design, it is one or the other. This is due to these requirings ecialist practical

Science

5 hours per week covering the key science subjects of Biology, Chemistry and Physics. This is worth 2 GCSEs and is called Double Science (Trilogy Paper)

If you child wishes to study Science at University then they might use one of their options choices to follow **Triple Science**, which will give them an extra two hours per week and will result in them achieving a GCSE in each of the three science subject (3 GCSEs in total)

Science

- Most students will study double science (Trilogy paper) which is worth 2 GCSEs. Issued as a double award e.g. 6-6
- Some students could take Triple Science (Single Science Paper) – worth 3 separate GCSEs
- 2 or 3 exam papers in each of the 3 separate subjects

Languages and reasons...

- We are 'Coubertin School' with the explicit aim of encouraging international cooperation
- Languages look great on a CV and can help get to a top University
- Languages can help make people more employable and open opportunities

Languages and reasons...

Whilst studying a Modern Foreign Language is not compulsory for students, we still encourage students to opt for one of these subjects

Firstly, because any student wishing to go to university will need to follow a broad and balanced academic pathway, of which a language is an important part

Secondly, our language epartment is brilliant!

Modified Curriculum and Alternative Pathways

There is a pathway for some of our students who may need additional support to follow a modified curriculum by choosing fewer subjects and having extra support. These students will be guided by our SENDCO (Ms Bennett) and our Teaching Support Team.

At the moment we do not have an Alternative Program, such as Construction, as we have had in the past. We will consider such modifications or specific learning plans on an individual basis once year 10 has started. This is not an option at this moment.


What is the role of the student?

- To take the process seriously
- To make good choices by understanding what decisions can be made
- To appreciate that some Options may not be possible due to ability, numbers, etc.
- To use data from Reports, Parents Evenings and own experience
- To make the best decisions and not just go along with friends

Things to consider

- The majority of exams will be terminal (at the end of 2 years of study)
- Only BTEC/CNAT subjects will use controlled assessments
- Ensure that you have a balanced approach to your options choices
- For those aspiring to university, seriously consider choosing a humanities and a language as part of your program

We are using a new software program this year that will link to the new school system. It is called 'Edval Choice', and it will hopefully make things easier.




How it works

Your child will receive an email, to their school email address, that will give them what is called a 'Webcode' and a link to an online form. They will click on the link and then enter the Webcode (works like a personal password). This will then bring them to the online form.




The online form






